

## 2025 Sexual Misconduct Campus Climate Survey

### Introduction and Background

Illinois College is dedicated to fostering a caring community on our campus. Preventing and remedying sexual misconduct at IC is essential to a safe environment in which our students can learn and thrive. The college administered the *Sexual Misconduct Campus Climate Survey* in Spring 2025 to better understand students' experiences of sexual misconduct (which includes sexual or gender-based harassment, stalking, dating/domestic violence, and sexual violence), students' knowledge of the resources available to them, and perception of the response to incidents of sexual misconduct.

#### **Survey Background**

On August 6, 2021, a bill written by students and supported by survivor advocates in Illinois was signed into law by amending the Preventing Sexual Violence in Higher Education Act. This new law, Public Act 102-0325 (110 ILCS 155/35), mandated all institutions of higher education conduct an annual campus sexual misconduct climate survey to assess students' experiences, outcomes regarding their experiences, and perceptions of sexual violence and collegiate culture. The law called for the creation of a Task Force on Sexual Misconduct on Campus Climate Surveys to develop the base survey instrument and implementation guidance. The Task Force was charged with creating a "base survey," which focuses on 13 areas outlined in the statute:

- The number, type, and location of reported and unreported incidents of sexual misconduct.
- Student awareness of institutions' sexual misconduct policies and procedures.
- Whether the student was referred to victim support services and whether students were provided information on his/her/their rights.
- Student demographic information such as race/ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, disability status, and immigration status to help identify at-risk groups.
- The perceptions of campus safety and confidence in the higher education institution's ability to protect students against sexual misconduct.
- Contextual factors of a sexual misconduct incident and any student academic outcomes, such as withdrawing from classes or being placed on academic probation.

While Illinois College has conducted sexual misconduct surveys in the past, this is the first use of the new survey instrument created by the Task Force. As such, no direct year-over-year comparisons are available.

#### **Administration**

#### Dates and Population

Illinois College administered the survey to students **March 17 - April 18, 2025.** The survey was sent to all students enrolled in at least one credit hour in the following academic terms: Spring 2025, Fall 2024, Summer 2024. Participants were required to have been at least 18 years of age. A total of 1,077 students or former students were invited.

#### Recruitment

Students were informed of the survey through campus emails from Title IX Coordinator, Angela Valuck. Posters were placed in campus classroom and resources buildings, and residence halls. Staff who work directly with students and student groups were informed of the survey and asked to encourage student participation. Postcards with the survey information were distributed at various events (e.g. Walk-a-Mile event). Advertisements ran on all campus digital displays and daily in the Hilltop Happenings event announcement.

#### Survey Administration

Student privacy and security were the primary concerns when administering the survey instrument. Personally identifiable information was not retained. Respondents were presented with the required informed consent that included notifying respondents the survey was voluntary, and they could skip any question.

The survey was offered in English only. The base survey contained seven questions that were modifiable by the institutions. Illinois College's modifications included:

- Question 4 Modified "A race/ethnicity not listed here" to "Other"
- Question 5 Modified "2017" to "2017 or prior". Removed "prior to 2017". Added 2024 and 2025 as an option.
- Question 7 Modified "Fraternity or sorority" to "Literary Society or APO". Modified "Other student organization or group" to "Student organization". Added "Honor Societies" and "TRiO".
- Question 9 Removed "off-campus institution-sponsored apartment/house" and "Off-campus housing non-institution sponsored". Modified "Other off-campus" to "Off-campus housing".
- Question 18 We added examples to align with campus services. a: (ex. public safety, counseling, wellness center). b: no change. c: (ex. including local and national.); d. No change.
- Question 87 Modified "Taken a class to learn more about sexual misconduct" to "Completed an online training or class related to sexual misconduct".
- Question 88 No change.
